- Meeting was called to order by Secretary Melinda Gustin at 10:08AM. A Quorum was established.
- Agenda Item 2. Public Comment: No Public Comment
- Agenda Item 3. Meeting minutes of August 10, 2018. Motion to approve by Stan Southwick, Second by Melinda Gustin Motion Passed. Laura and Marc recused as they were not at the meeting.

New Board members Laura Miller and Marc Chapelle were introduced and provided background on their experience.

New Business Item for license reciprocity and LAIT was moved to this time as the participants were in attendance. The board reviewed Mr. Shawn Maestretti, application for reciprocity. Mr. Maestretti was asked to provide a comment on his experience.

A motion to Approve was made by Marc Chapelle, Second by Stan Southwick. Motion Passed.

The board reviewed Ms. Autumn Schneider application for Landscape Architect-in-Training. Ms. Schneider was asked to comment on her experience and education. A motion to Approve was made by Laura Miller, Second by Marc Chapelle. Motion Passed.



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The board reviewed the reciprocity application of Mr. Patrick Diaz. A waiver had been received from Mr. Diaz. Motion to Approve by Marc Chapelle, Second by Laura Miller. Motion Passed.

The board reviewed the reciprocity of Mr. Eric Roverud. Motion to Approve by Laura Miller, Second by Marc Chapelle. Motion Passed.

- Agenda Item 4. A. A discussion of letter from Interim Sunset Review Committee dated October 1, 2018 and the bill draft request that the Sunset Review Committee followed. This pertained to the committee recommendation that a bill be brought forward to allow for credit card and electronic acceptance of payment for fees. Also, to change the Nevada Revised Statute (NRS and Nevada Administrative Code 623A (NAC) to eliminate the President from reviewing complaints and placing the authority with the Executive Director. No action taken.
- Agenda Item 4 B. A preliminary set of policies for Continuing Education was presented. This utilized the information gathered from the approved regulation, the workshops and meetings held on this subject. A discussion followed. The board members were tasked with reviewing the information and commenting on it, with edits going to the Executive Director that will be disseminated to the board. The board will discuss the comments at the next board meeting.
- Agenda Item 4 C. A preliminary policy was distributed concerning the changes to disciplinary investigation in NAC 623A. This removes the President and/or a designated board member from reviewing the complaint and provides for the Executive Director to have the authority to determine the validity and to proceed with an investigation. Motion to Approve by Marc Chapelle, Second by Laura Miller. Motion Passed.
- Agenda Item 4 D. The board discussed the proposed changes to NRS 623A. Changes regarding increase in the maximum amount for fees, ability to accept credit cards and electronic payments, and eliminating the President and/or designated board



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member for complaints, allowing the Executive Director to have authority to determine action on complaint. A comment from Jana Vanderhaar concerning creating a tiered system for new Licensee, rather than the current fee schedule. A discussion from the board followed. It was mentioned by Henna Rasul, Deputy Attorney General, that as this will be brought up to the legislature, the public is able to bring this idea to the legislature at their hearing on this bill. No action was taken, this was for information only at this time.

Executive Director's Report:

Α.

The total balance of the accounts as of December 4, 2018 was presented. A question concerning the outstanding credit card balance was asked. The credit card is used for trips, such as the CLARB annual meeting, office supplies and other board expenses.

A review of the year to date Profit & Loss was reviewed as it pertained to the budget. The budget amounts did not populate the line items, although there was a total amount at the bottom of each section.

Β.

Number of Registered L.A.'s in Nevada is 356 plus the 3 added at this meeting.

The number of those registered by administrative policy for the past quarter was 5. It was explained that the past board had given the authority to administratively approve reciprocity if the person is CLARB certified with no disciplinary actions again them.

C.

The Governor's Audit of the Occupational Boards was reviewed and discussed. Recently, the report for phase II of the audit was announced that it was to be released soon. The preliminary report that was released showed what boards were being looked at, especially the salary of the Executive Director. The Landscape Board is not being reviewed at this time. As the board complies with the governing statutes and administrative codes. No action was taken.

D. Preparing for the 2019 Legislative Session was discussed. The board discussed having a part-time lobbyist for this coming session. The Executive Director, and a board member will contact a couple of lobbyist and ask for a proposal for a retainer contract. Motion by Marc Chapelle, Second by Laura Miller. Motion Passed.



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The proposals will be brought to the board at the next meeting.

A presentation by the Mr. David Farley, President of Nevada ASLA Chapter concerning their hiring of a lobbyist for the 2019 session was made. It was pointed out by Ms. Henna Rasul, that the Association (ASLA) and the

Landscape Board (a regulatory agency) are to remain separate with regard to hiring a lobbyist.

E. Concerning Certificate Layout, no information on this subject was available.

6. New Business:

Item 6A. Welcome of New Members and discussion of orientation materials and meetings followed. Item 6 B. New Licensees: these approved earlier in the meeting. See page 1. Item 6 C. The Nevada Specific Exam now has 3 versions that are used. A request for new questions and back-up material was made of the board. 5 questions for each section of the exam was requested from the board members. A copy of the exam will be sent to each L.A. member to review and use as a template for the new questions. Item 6 D. A discussion of using the digital stamp and a digital stamp service followed. Some jurisdictions require wet stamp and signature, a digital stamp is not used. The costs were discussed and commented that they are too expensive. No action was taken at this time. Item 6 E. Election of Officers for 2019: President: Melinda Gustin, Motion by Stan, Second by Marc, Passed. Secretary: Stan Southwick, Motion by Marc, Second by Laura. Passed CLARB Representative: Marc Chapelle, Motion by Laura, Second by Stan, Passed. Outreach: Ryan Hansen, Motion by Marc, Second by Stan, Passed. Communication: Laura Miller, Motion by Marc, Second by Stan. Passed.

SENATE BILL NO. 128-COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND LABOR

(ON BEHALF OF THE SUNSET SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION)

PREFILED FEBRUARY 1, 2019

Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the administration of occupational licensing boards. (BDR 54-518)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to occupational licensing boards; authorizing certain occupational licensing boards to contract for the acceptance of credit cards, debit cards or electronic transfers of money for certain payments or to participate in such a contract entered into by the Director of the Office of Finance; revising provisions governing the forms of payment authorized to be accepted by the State Board of Landscape Architecture; revising provisions governing the review of complaints filed with the State Board of Landscape Architecture; requiring members of the Nevada Physical Therapy Board to attend certain training; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes certain state agencies to enter into a contract with 2 issuers of credit cards or debit cards, or with operators of systems that provide for 3 the electronic transfer of money, to provide for the acceptance of credit cards, debit 4 cards or electronic transfers of money by such state agencies. (NRS 353.1465, 5 353.1466) Section 1 of this bill authorizes certain occupational licensing boards to 6 enter into such contracts with issuers of credit cards or debit cards, or with 7 operators of systems that provide for the electronic transfer of money, to provide 8 for the acceptance of such forms of payment by such occupational licensing boards 9 or to participate in such a contract entered into by the Director of the Office of 0 Finance. Section 2 of this bill makes a conforming change to specifically authorize





11 the State Board to accept credit cards, debit cards and electronic transfers of money 12 13 in addition to checks, cashier's checks and money orders.

Existing law requires the President or a designated member of the State Board 14 of Landscape Architecture to consider each complaint filed with the State Board 15 and make a recommendation to the State Board if it appears further proceedings are 16 warranted. (NRS 623A.305) Section 3 of this bill requires the Executive Director 17 of the State Board to perform such duties.

18 Section 4 of this bill requires each new member of the Nevada Physical 19 Therapy Board to attend certain training, which existing law requires the Attorney 20

General to provide to members of occupational licensing boards. (NRS 622.200)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 622 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto a new section to read as follows: 3

1. A licensing board may:

4 (a) Enter into a contract with an issuer of credit cards or debit cards or an operator of a system that provides for the electronic 5 transfer of money to provide for the acceptance of credit cards, 6 7 debit cards or electronic transfers of money by the licensing 8 board: or

9 (b) Upon approval of the Director of the Office of Finance, participate in a contract entered into by the Director pursuant to 10 11 NRS 353,1466.

12 2. If the issuer or operator charges the licensing board a fee 13 for each use of a credit card or debit card or for each electronic 14 transfer of money, the licensing board may require the cardholder 15 or the person requesting the electronic transfer of money to pay a convenience fee when appropriate and authorized. The total 16 convenience fees charged by the licensing board in a fiscal year 17 must not exceed the total amount of fees charged to the licensing 18 19 board by the issuer or operator in that fiscal year.

20

3. As used in this section:

(a) "Cardholder" means the person or organization named on 21 22 the face of a credit card or debit card to whom or for whose benefit 23 the credit card or debit card is issued by an issuer.

(b) "Convenience fee" means a fee paid by a cardholder or 24 25 person requesting the electronic transfer of money to a licensing 26 board for the convenience of using the credit card or debit card or 27 the electronic transfer of money to make such payment.

28 (c) "Credit card" means any instrument or device, whether 29 known as a credit card or credit plate or by any other name, issued with or without a fee by an issuer for the use of the cardholder in 30 obtaining money, property, goods, services or anything else of 31 32 value on credit.





1	(d) "Debit card" means any instrument or device, whether
2	known as a debit card or by any other name, issued with or
3	without a fee by an issuer for the use of the cardholder in
4	depositing, obtaining or transferring funds.
5	(e) "Electronic transfer of money" has the meaning ascribed

7	(f) "Issuer" means a business organization, financial
8	institution or authorized agent of a business organization or
9	financial institution that issues a credit card or a debit card.
10	(g) "Licensing board" means a board created by the provisions
11	of chapters 623 to 625A, inclusive, 628, 630 to 644A, inclusive,
12	648, 654 and 656 of NRS.

If a landscape architect intern pays the 37 fee or any portion of the fee during that period, the Board shall 38 credit the amount paid towards the entire amount of the application 39 fee for the certificate of registration required pursuant to this 40 section.

4. The fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to this section must be paid in United States currency in the form of a check,
4. cashier's check or money order [-] or, if the Board has entered into
4. or is participating in a contract pursuant to section 1 of this act, in
4. any other form of payment authorized pursuant to section 1 of this





act. If any [check] form of payment submitted to the Board is 1 2 dishonored upon presentation for payment, repayment of the fee, 3 including the fee for any returned the payment in the amount established by the State Controller pursuant to NRS 4 5 353C.115, must be made by money order or certified check.

6 The fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to this section are 7 nonrefundable. 8

Sec. 3. NRS 623A.305 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 623A.305 1. When a complaint is filed with the Executive Director of the Board, it must be considered by the **President** 10 Executive Director of the Board . for a member of the Board 11 designated by the President.] If it appears to the President or the 12 13 person designated by the President Executive Director that further 14 proceedings are warranted, he or she shall report the results of the 15 investigation together with a recommendation to the Board in a 16 manner which does not violate the right of the person charged in the complaint to due process in any later hearing on the complaint. 17

18 The Board shall promptly make a determination with respect 2. 19 to each complaint reported to it by the President or a person designated by the President| Executive Director and shall dismiss 20 21 the complaint or proceed with disciplinary action pursuant to 22 chapter 622A of NRS. 23

Sec. 4. NRS 640.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:

24 640.030 1. The Nevada Physical Therapy Board, consisting 25 of five members appointed by the Governor, and any nonvoting advisory members appointed by the Board pursuant to NRS 26 640.055, is hereby created. 27 28

The Governor shall appoint:

29 (a) Three members who are licensed physical therapists in the 30 State of Nevada.

31 (b) One member who is a licensed physical therapist assistant in 32 the State of Nevada.

33 (c) One member who is a representative of the general public. 34 This member must not be:

35

(1) A physical therapist or a physical therapist assistant; or

(2) The spouse or the parent or child, by blood, marriage or 36 37 adoption, of a physical therapist or a physical therapist assistant.

No member of the Board may serve more than two 38 3. 39 consecutive terms.

The Governor may remove any voting member of the Board 40 4. 41 for incompetency, neglect of duty, gross immorality or malfeasance 42 in office.

43 A majority of the voting members of the Board constitutes a 5. 44 auorum.





1 6. No member of the Board may be held liable in a civil action 2 for any act which he or she has performed in good faith in the 3 execution of his or her duties under this chapter.

7. The Board shall comply with the provisions of chapter 241
 of NRS, and all meetings of the Board must be conducted in
 accordance with that chapter.

7 8. Each member of the Board, as soon as practicable after 8 being first appointed to serve as a member of the Board, shall 9 attend the training provided by the Office of the Attorney General 10 pursuant to NRS 622.200.

11 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.

Agenda item 4B

Continuing Education Policy-Draft

As per NAC623A.315 the following policy is set forth by the Nevada State Board of Landscape Architecture to assist in the regulation of Continuing Education Credits and for the renewal of individuals for licensure in the state.

Credits Earned: 8 minimum

Self-directed educational activity: 4 credits maximum. Educational Activity primarily engaged in subject mater relating to public health, safety and welfare not in a systematically presented manner by another person.

Structured educational activity: 8 credits maximum. An educational activity in which teaching methodology is used to present technical and professional subjects by qualified persons relating to health, safety and welfare.

Credits carried forward: 4 maximum. Earned credits over the 8 maximum in selfdirected or structured educational activities may be applied to the following fiscal year.

Credits defined: 1 continuing education credit equals 50 minutes of structured educational activity. 0.5 continuing education credit equals not less than 25 minutes of structured educational activity.

Self-Structured credit: 1 continuing education credit equals

Registrant to retain records to support Continuing Education Activities for three (3) years after date of renewal.

For structured study: Verification of attendance form will be accepted from the organizations listed above with the participants Name, Date attended, Topic/Subject and CE attained.

For Self-Structured study: Verification form provided by board which shows the type of activity claimed, title, sponsoring organization, mode of delivery, duration, name of the author(s), and continuing education units earned. A summary of the topic in 25 words.

Audit: Yearly, 3-5% of registrants. Random selection by license number. Will not audit same number in consecutive years, unless, prior year indicated a discrepancy or failure to provide required amount of CE's. The registrant found deficient in the required number of credits will be given 30 days to make-up the deficiency and report to the board with verification from the accepted organization as to participants Name, Date Attended, Topic/Subject and CE attained. The registrant will be assessed a late fee in the amount of the delinquency fee for renewal of the license.

Documentation. Each licensee shall maintain documentation as proof of compliance on a form prescribed by the Board, which shows:

- (1) the date of the activity;
- (2) the name of the activity provider;
- (3) the name of the instructor;
- (4) the activity title;
- (5) the number of contact hours of continuing education credit; and
- (6) the activity objectives.
- (7) certificate of completion or school transcript,
- (8) activity description,
- (9) activity syllabi, or other activity materials.

Non-compliance of fulfilling Continuing Education will result in non-renewal of registrant's license.

Appeal: Registrant may appeal the decision to the Board for a hearing, within 30 days of notice of non-compliance. The decision of the board is final.

Exemptions.

1. A registrant holding an initial certificate of registration issued by the Board, is exempt from the requirements for continuing education for the year in which the certificate of registration was issued and the next following year.

2. A registrant who serves on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States for a period of more than 120 consecutive days during a calendar year is exempt from the requirements for continuing education for that calendar year.

3. The Board may exempt a registrant from the requirements for continuing education if the registrant cannot meet the requirements because of illness, physical disability or undue hardship, as determined by the Board based on documentation provided by the registrant before the date of expiration of the certificate of registration.

Credit for continuing education shall be recognized in accordance with the following:

(a) a maximum of three hours per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for teaching in a college or university or for teaching continuing education activities in the field of landscape architecture, provided it is the first time the material was taught;

(b) a maximum of one hour per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for authoring or study of published papers, articles, or books directly related to the

practice of landscape architecture;

(c) a maximum of two hours per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for pro-bono service that has a clear purpose and objective and maintains, improves, and expands the professional knowledge or skill of the licensee;

(d) a maximum of one hour per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for mentoring one or more students for one day at the American Society of Landscape Architecture Annual Meeting, mentoring program, or other mentoring event;

(e) a maximum of two hours per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for membership on a state regulatory board for the practice of landscape architecture;

(f) a maximum of one hour per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for serving as an elected officer or appointed chair of a committee or organization in a professional society or organization related to the practice of landscape architecture;

(g) a maximum of one hour per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for serving as an elected officer or appointed member of a governmental board or commission related to the practice of landscape architecture; (h) a maximum of two hours per one year renewal cycle may be recognized for serving as an exam grader or on a committee writing exam materials for a professional registration or licensing examination; and
(i) The Maximum number of required hours may be recognized for continuing education that is online, distance-learning, correspondence course, or home study provided the activity verifies registration and participation in the activity by means of a test or other assessment method including a final summary, individual paper, or individual project which demonstrates that the participant learned the material presented.

A continuing education activity shall meet the following standards:

(a) Activity Content and Types. The activity shall have an identifiable, clear statement of purpose and defined objective directly related to the practice of landscape architecture and directly related to topics involving the public health, safety, and welfare of landscape architecture practice and the ethical standards of landscape architectural practice.

(i) Health, safety, welfare, and ethical standards as used in this Subsection are defined to including the following:

(A) The definition of "health" shall include aspects of landscape architectural practice that have salutary effects among users of sites, site structures, pedestrian ways, and vehicular facilities that are environmental and affect human health. Examples include all aspects of air quality, provisions of personal hygiene, and use of non-toxic materials and finishes.

(B) The definition of "safety" shall include aspects of landscape architectural practice intended to limit or prevent accidental injury or death among users such as sites, site structures, or construction sites. Examples include safe access and egress within sites and site structures, minimization of slipping hazards on exterior surfaces, correct proportions and visibility of stairs, safety railings, and accommodations for users with disabilities.

(C) The definition of "welfare" shall include aspects of landscape architectural practice that consist of values that may be social, psychological, cultural, spiritual, physical, aesthetic, and monetary in nature. Examples include spaces that afford natural light, natural materials, or views of nature or whose proportions, color, or materials engender positive emotional responses from its users.

(D) The definition of "ethical standards for landscape architectural practice" shall include the ASLA Code of Professional Ethics and as specified in NAC623A.480

(ii) The activity shall be completed in the form of any of the following activity types:

(A) in-house programs sponsored by an organization;

(B) seminar;

(C) lecture;

(D) conference;

(E) training session;

(F) webinar;

(G) internet course;

(H) distance learning course;

(I) televised course;

(J) authoring of an article, textbook, or professional book publication;

(K) lecturing in or instructing a continuing education course;

(L) study of a scholarly peer-reviewed journal article, book, or book chapter;

(M) pro-bono service that has a clear purpose and objective and maintains, improves, or expands the professional knowledge or skill of the licensee;

(N) mentoring one or more students for one day at the American Society of Landscape Architecture Annual Meeting, mentoring program, or other mentoring event;
(O) membership on a state regulatory board for the practice of landscape architecture;

(P) serving as an elected officer or appointed chair of a committee or organization in a professional society or organization;

(Q) serving as an elected officer or appointed member of a professional board or commission; or

(R) serving as an exam grader or on a committee writing exam materials for a professional registration or licensing examination.

(b) Objectives. The activity learning objectives shall be clearly stated in activity material.

(c) Faculty. The activity shall be prepared and presented by individuals who are qualified by education, training, and experience.

(d) Activity provider or sponsor. The activity shall be approved by, conducted by, or under the sponsorship of one of the following:

(i) an accredited college or university;

(ii) a state or federal agency;

(iii) a professional association, organization, or company related to the practice of landscape architecture; or

(iv) a commercial continuing education provider providing an activity related to the practice of landscape architecture.

If the activity is self-directed, such as study or authoring of a scholarly peer-reviewed journal article, book, book chapter, or similar document, the documentation shall contain the following:

(A) the dates of study or research;

(B) the title of the paper, article, or book;

(C) an abstract of the paper, article, or book;

(D) the number of contact hours of continuing education credit; and

(E) the objectives of the self-study activity.

(f) Contact hour. Each contact hour of continuing education credit shall consist of not fewer than 50 minutes of education. One professional development hour (PDH) is equal to one contact hour. One university quarter credit hour is equivalent to 40 contact hours. One university semester credit hour is equivalent to 45 contact hours. One International Association of Continuing Education and Training (IACET) Continuing Education Unit CEU is equivalent to ten contact hours.

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to landscape architecture. (BDR 54-612)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets (omitted material) is material to be omitted

AN ACT relating to landscape architecture; requiring the State Board of Landscape Architecture to accept credit cards, debit cards and electronic transfers of money for the payment of certain fees; authorizing the Board to contract for the acceptance of such methods of payment; increasing the maximum amount of fees relating to the licensure of a landscape architect and a landscape architect intern; revising provisions relating to complaints filed with the State Board of Landscape Architecture; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law prohibits a person from engaging in the practice of landscape 234567 architecture unless he or she has been issued a certificate of registration or a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern by the State Board of Landscape Architecture. (NRS 623A.165) Existing law requires the Board to prescribe certain fees related to the issuance and renewal of a certificate of registration and a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. (NRS 623A.240) Section 2 of this bill increases the maximum amount of such fees and 8 provides that the fees are payable in advance. Section 2 also specifies that the 9 Board must prescribe a separate application fee for a certificate of registration and a 10 certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern and authorizes the Board to 11 credit money paid to apply for a certificate to practice as a landscape architect 12 intern toward the application fee for a certificate of registration.

13 Under existing law, all fees paid to the Board must be paid in the form of a 14 check, cashier's check or money order. (NRS 623A.240) Section 2 expands the 15 acceptable forms of payment to include credit cards, debit cards and electronic 16 transfers of money. Section 1 of this bill authorizes the Board to enter into 17 contracts with issuers of credit cards, debit cards or operators of systems that





18 provide for the electronic transfer of money to provide for the acceptance of such 19 methods of payment and authorizes the Board to charge and collect a convenience 20 fee in certain circumstances.

21 Under existing law, complaints against a landscape architect or landscape 22 architect intern may be filed with the Executive Director of the State Board of 23 Landscape Architecture. (NRS 623A.290) The President of the Board or a designee 24 of the President is required to consider the complaint and make a recommendation 25 to the Board if further proceedings are warranted. (NRS 623A.305) Section 3 of 26 this bill removes the President or his or her designee from this process and instead 27 requires the Executive Director to consider each complaint and make a 28 recommendation to the Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Dear President Hansen:

The Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission (*Nevada Revised Statutes* [NRS] 232B.210) has completed its work for the 2017–2018 Interim, including reviews of several occupational and professional licensing boards established by acts of the Nevada Legislature. Pursuant to statute, the Subcommittee is charged with determining whether those entities should be continued, modified, consolidated, or terminated. At the completion of each interim, the Subcommittee reports its recommendations to the Legislative Commission.

At its meeting on February 21, 2018, the Subcommittee considered the State Board of Landscape Architecture (NRS 623A.080). At that time, Subcommittee members reviewed with representatives the Board's continuing education policies, its fees and expenses, and accessibility to forms and other functions online for the convenience of certificate holders. Representatives of the Board also noted that statutes limit certain financial transactions involving the Board to United States currency in the form of a cashier's check, check, or money order.

The Board representatives also identified a revision to its practice act governing operations. Existing statutes provide that the president of the Board or a designated Board member must review a complaint filed with the executive director. Because this requirement effectively eliminates that person from subsequent participation in a later hearing on the complaint, the Board suggested revising these procedures by substituting the executive director for the president or any Board member.

At its work session on March 21, 2018, the Subcommittee recommended continuation of the Board. It also voted to recommend amending provisions of NRS to provide that the executive director, rather than the president or any designated Board member, consider a complaint that is filed with the Board to determine if further proceedings are warranted. In addition, the Subcommittee voted to recommend revisions to statutory provisions to authorize, but not require, each board or commission provided for in Title 54 ("Professions, Occupations and Businesses") of NRS to enter into or participate in a contract to accept credit cards and other electronic transfers

of money or to participate in such a contract entered into by the director of the Office of Finance, Office of the Governor.

Finally, in March, the Subcommittee voted to request to be informed when the Board's continuing education policy is implemented. The Subcommittee intends this letter to serve as notification that it wishes the Board to provide such information in the next interim.

Thank you for your attention to this request and for all of the assistance provided by members of the Board and staff as the Subcommittee conducted its reviews and completed its work. Please plan to submit the requested information at the direction of the Subcommittee when it convenes again in the 2019–2020 Interim. As always, please do not hesitate to contact me if the Subcommittee or I may be of assistance.

Dear Chair Bustamante Adams:

On December 8, 2017, we presented a review of our financial oversight over certain state boards to the Legislative Commission's Sunset Subcommittee. In the past, legislators have questioned whether board reserves are excessive and if there is a standard for how many months of reserves should be maintained. The following information is presented to help answer those questions and enhance financial transparency over occupational licensing boards.

Based on our review of financial information submitted to us in accordance with NRS 218G.400, we found 27 of 34 (79%) occupational licensing boards have reserves to fund operations for more than 6 months, with 18 (53%) having over 12 months in reserves. As noted below, we concluded a reserve equivalent to 6 months of operating costs would likely be sufficient for Nevada's occupational licensing boards.

Our work did not constitute an audit performed in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. We reviewed and analyzed financial information previously submitted to the Audit Division, and we did not contact any board for clarification regarding the planned use of reserves or the need to maintain reserves in excess of 6 months.

Our review of literature revealed a reserve of 3 to 6 months of operating costs to be a common best practice for boards and nonprofit organizations. Reserves should not be used to cover a long-term or permanent revenue shortfall, but allow time to solve temporary problems, not structural financial problems. Boards should balance the need to fund revenue shortfalls or unforeseen costs, while making sure licensees are not overburdened with excessive fees.

Based on our review, we concluded a reserve equivalent to 6 months of operating costs would likely be sufficient for Nevada's occupational licensing boards. While we realize each board's specific needs and financial circumstances may vary, 6 months of operating costs should

be adequate for funding unexpected financial shortfalls. The table below illustrates two scenarios using a reserve equivalent to 6 months of operating costs. In both scenarios, a 6-month reserve will allow a board to operate for 1 year while the board makes adjustments to stabilize operations.

GASB 68 Adjustments

With the implementation of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 68, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions*, some boards' reserves were significantly reduced by recording the boards' share of the Public Employees' Retirement System of Nevada (PERS) pension liability in their financial statements. However, this liability is not under the boards' control and there is no process for immediate payment by the boards. As a result, the implementation of GASB 68 understates the funds available for use by the boards to conduct its operations, and some boards have a negative fund balance solely because of GASB 68 implementation. Therefore, we have added back the GASB 68 adjustments to the boards' reserves to provide a more accurate picture of available funds.

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to landscape architecture. (BDR 54-612)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded itakics is new; matter between brackets (omitted material) is material to be omitted

AN ACT relating to landscape architecture; requiring the State Board of Landscape Architecture to accept credit cards, debit cards and electronic transfers of money for the payment of certain fees; authorizing the Board to contract for the acceptance of such methods of payment; increasing the maximum amount of fees relating to the licensure of a landscape architect and a landscape architect intern; revising provisions relating to complaints filed with the State Board of Landscape Architecture; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law prohibits a person from engaging in the practice of landscape architecture unless he or she has been issued a certificate of registration or a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern by the State Board of Landscape Architecture. (NRS 623A.165) Existing law requires the Board to prescribe certain fees related to the issuance and renewal of a certificate of registration and a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. (NRS 623A.240) Section 2 of this bill increases the maximum amount of such fees and provides that the fees are payable in advance. Section 2 also specifies that the Board must prescribe a separate application fee for a certificate of registration and a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. and authorizes the Board to redit money paid to apply for a certificate of registration.

13 Under existing law, all fees paid to the Board must be paid in the form of a 14 check, cashier's check or money order. (NRS 623A.240) Section 2 expands the 15 acceptable forms of payment to include credit cards, debit cards and electronic 16 transfers of money. Section 1 of this bill authorizes the Board to enter into 17 contracts with issuers of credit cards, debit cards or operators of systems that





18 provide for the electronic transfer of money to provide for the acceptance of such 19 methods of payment and authorizes the Board to charge and collect a convenience 20 fee in certain circumstances.

21 Under existing law, complaints against a landscape architect or landscape 22 architect intern may be filed with the Executive Director of the State Board of 23 Landscape Architecture. (NRS 623A.290) The President of the Board or a designee 24 of the President is required to consider the complaint and make a recommendation 25 to the Board if further proceedings are warranted. (NRS 623A.305) Section 3 of 26 this bill removes the President or his or her designee from this process and instead 27 requires the Executive Director to consider each complaint and make a 28 recommendation to the Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

4. Has not committed fraud or misrepresentation in connection with:

(a) The submission of an application for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern; or

(b) The taking of one or more examinations pursuant to the provisions of this chapter;

5. Has not had a license. certificate, or registration of registration suspended or revoked by the Board or in any other state or country;

6. Has not, in lieu of receiving disciplinary action, surrendered a license, certificate, registration of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern in this State or a certificate or license license, certificate or registration to practice landscape architecture issued in another state or country;

7. Has not engaged in the practice of landscape architecture in this State or in any other state or country without a license, or certificate of or registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect or landscape architect intern within the 2 years immediately preceding the filing of an application for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern pursuant to the provisions of this chapter; or

8. Has not, within the 5 years immediately preceding the filing of an application specified in subsection 7, engaged in unprofessional conduct in violation of the regulations adopted by the Board.

NRS 623A.070 Applicability of chapter.

1. This chapter does not apply to:

(a) Owners of property who make plans, specifications or drawings for their own property.

STATE BOARD OF LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

NRS 623A.080 Creation; number, appointment and qualifications of members; terms; oaths; removal; vacancies; immunity.

1. The State Board of Landscape Architecture, consisting of five members appointed by the Governor, is hereby created.

2. The Governor shall appoint:

(a) Four members who, at the time of their appointment, are not the subject of any disciplinary action by the Board and who, for not less than 3 years immediately preceding their appointment, have been:

(1) Engaged in the practice of landscape architecture; and

(2) Holders of a license certificates of registration; and

(b) One member who is a representative of the general public. This member must not be:

(1) A landscape architect or a landscape architect intern; or

(2) The spouse or the parent or child, by blood, marriage or adoption, of a landscape architect or a landscape architect intern.

3. Each member must have been a resident of this State for not less than 3 years immediately preceding appointment to the Board.

4. A member of the Board shall not serve for more than three terms.

5. Each member of the Board shall, within 30 days after being appointed, take and subscribe to the oath of office as prescribed by the laws of this State and file the oath with the Secretary of State.

6. Upon receipt of a complaint concerning a member of the Board and for good cause shown, the Governor may, after providing 10 days' notice to the member and providing an opportunity for a hearing, remove the member for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office.

7. An appointment to fill a vacancy in the membership of the Board for a cause other than expiration of the term must be for the unexpired portion of the term.

8. A member, agent or employee of the Board or any hearing officer or member of a hearing panel appointed by the Board is immune from personal liability relating to any action taken in good faith and within the scope of his or her authority.

NRS 623A.090 Salary of members; per diem allowance and travel expenses of members and employees.

1. Members of the Board are entitled to receive:

(a) A salary of not more than \$150 per day, as fixed by the Board, while engaged in the business of the Board; and

(b) A per diem allowance and travel expenses, at a rate fixed by the Board, while engaged in the business of the Board. The rate must not exceed the rate provided for state officers and employees generally.

2. While engaged in the business of the Board, each employee of the Board is entitled to receive a per diem allowance and travel expenses at a rate fixed by the Board. The rate must not exceed the rate provided for state officers and employees generally.

3. Any salary, per diem allowance or travel expenses paid pursuant to the provisions of this section must be paid from money kept or deposited by the Board in accordance with the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.150</u>.

NRS 623A.100 Officers; appointment, salary and duties of Executive Director.

1. At each annual meeting of the Board, the members shall:

(a) Elect a President and a Secretary; and

2. The President and the Secretary of the Board serve without additional compensation.

3. The Executive Director must not be a member of the Board and is entitled to a salary fixed by the Board.

4. The Executive Director shall:

(a) Keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the Board;

(b) Maintain custody of the official seal;

(c) Maintain a file containing the names and addresses of all license holders-of certificates of registration and certificates to practice as a landscape architect intern;

(d) Submit to the Board each application for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern that is filed with the Board;

(e) If a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern has violated any provision of this chapter, file a complaint with the Attorney General; and

(f) Perform any other duties assigned by the Board.

NRS 623A.110 Meetings; quorum.

1. The Board shall meet at least once each calendar quarter for the purpose of transacting its regular business and may meet at any other time as the Board designates.

2. Special meetings of the Board must be called by the Executive Director upon the written request of any member, by giving 20 days' written notice of the meeting and the time and place the meeting is to be held to each member of the Board.

3. Three members of the Board constitute a quorum.

NRS 623A.120 Employees: Hiring, compensation and reimbursement. The Board may:

1. Employ and fix the compensation for legal counsel, inspectors, special agents, investigators and clerical personnel necessary to the discharge of its duties; and

2. Reimburse an employee specified in subsection 1 for any actual expenses incurred by the employee while acting on behalf of the Board.

NRS 623A.130 Duties. The Board shall:

1. Adopt an official seal.

2. Administer and enforce the provisions of this chapter.

3. Adopt regulations for the administration of this chapter.

4. Administer and conduct comprehensive examinations of applicants, which must test the applicant's fitness to engage in the practice of landscape architecture.

NRS 623A.133 Preparation and adoption of code of conduct. The Board shall prepare and adopt a code of conduct for license holders of certificates of registration and holders of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. Before adopting the code, the Board shall send a copy of the proposed code to each holder of a certificate of registration and holder of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. Each holder of a license certificate of registration and holder of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern may vote on any provision included in the code. The Board may adopt each provision in the code unless 25 percent or more of the holders of certificates of registration vote against that provision.

The Board shall make the record available:

2. For sale to a member of the general public who is not a licensee holder of a certificate of registration or holder of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern.

2. The records described in this section may be disclosed, pursuant to procedures established by regulation of the Board, to:

(a) A court;

(b) An agency of the Federal Government;

(c) Another state;

(d) A political subdivision of this State; or

(e) Any other related professional board or organization.

3. The Board may report to any other related professional board and organization the score of an applicant on an examination administered by the Board.

4. Except as otherwise provided in this section and <u>NRS 239.0115</u>, a complaint filed with the Board, all documents and other information filed with the complaint and all documents and other information compiled as a result of an investigation conducted to determine whether to initiate disciplinary action against a person are confidential, unless the person submits a written statement to the Board requesting that such documents and information be made public records.

5. The charging documents filed with the Board to initiate disciplinary action pursuant to <u>chapter 622A</u> of NRS and all other documents and information considered by the Board when determining whether to impose discipline are public records.

6. The provisions of this section do not prohibit the Board from communicating or cooperating with or providing any documents or other information to any other licensing board or any other agency that is investigating a person, including, without limitation, a law enforcement agency.

2. Hold membership in any organization relating to landscape architects or the practice of landscape architecture; or

3. Administer examinations on behalf of any national association of registered boards that certifies landscape architects.

3. The expenses, including the per diem allowances and travel expenses of the members and employees of the Board while engaged in the business of the Board and the expenses to conduct examinations, must be paid from the current receipts. No portion thereof may be paid from the State Treasury.

4. Any balance remaining in excess of the expenses incurred may be retained by the Board and used to defray the future expenses of the Board.

5. In a manner consistent with the provisions of <u>chapter 622A</u> of NRS, the Board may delegate to a hearing officer or panel its authority to take any disciplinary action pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, impose and collect fines and penalties therefor and deposit the money therefrom in an account maintained by the Board in a bank, credit union or savings and loan association specified in subsection 1.

6. If a hearing officer or panel is not authorized to take disciplinary action pursuant to the provisions of subsection 5 and the Board deposits the money collected from the imposition of fines with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund, it may present a claim to the State Board of Examiners for recommendation to the Interim Finance Committee if money is needed to pay attorney's fees or the costs of an investigation, or both.

If an applicant complies with the provisions of this chapter and is otherwise qualified to engage in the practice of landscape architecture, the Board shall, upon payment by the applicant of the applicable fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS</u> <u>623A.240</u>, issue to the applicant a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. If a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is issued after the beginning of the fiscal year, the Board may prorate the fee that the applicant must pay for that year pursuant to those provisions.

3. Each license certificate of registration must include the complete name of the holder of the license certificate, the number of the license certificate, and the signatures of the President and Secretary of the Board.

NRS 623A.170 Certificate of registration Qualifications for License: Qualifications of applicant; application; study equivalent to work experience; standards for examinations; regulations; deadline for application.

1. Any person who:

(c) Is a citizen of the United States or is lawfully entitled to remain and work in the United States; and

(d) Has satisfied the requirements for education and experience in landscape architecture, in any combination deemed suitable by the Board,

The application must be accompanied by the application fee prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.240</u> and all information required to complete the application.

2. Each year of study, not exceeding 5 years of study, satisfactorily completed in a program of landscape architecture accredited by the Landscape Architectural Accrediting Board or a similar national board approved by the Board, or a program of landscape architecture in this State approved by the Board, is considered equivalent to 1 year of experience in landscape architectural work for the purpose of registration as a landscape architect.

3. The Board shall, by regulation, establish standards for examinations which may be consistent with standards employed by other states. The Board may adopt the standards of a national association of registered boards approved by the Board, and the examination and grading procedure of that organization, as they exist on the date of adoption. Examinations may include tests in such technical, professional and ethical subjects as are prescribed by the Board.

4. If the Board administers or causes to be administered an examination during:

(a) June of any year, an application to take that examination must be postmarked not later than March 1 of that year; or

(b) December of any year, an application to take that examination must be postmarked not later than September 1 of that year.

NRS 623A.180 Certificate of registration: Action of Board on application; notification of applicant.

(c) The applicant has paid the examination fee; and

(d) The applicant has submitted all information required to complete the application.

3. If the Board disapproves an application, the Executive Director shall promptly notify the applicant of the disapproval, stating the reasons therefor.

4. The Board may disapprove an application for any violation of the provisions of this chapter.

The statement must be completed and signed by the applicant.

2. The Board shall include the statement required pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 in:

(a) The application or any other forms that must be submitted for the issuance or renewal of the certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern; or

(b) A separate form prescribed by the Board.

3. A license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern may not be issued or renewed by the Board if the applicant:

(a) Fails to submit the statement required pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1; or

(b) Indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order.

4. If an applicant indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order, the Board shall advise the applicant to contact the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order to determine the actions that the applicant may take to satisfy the arrearage.

In addition to any other requirements set forth in this chapter, an applicant for the issuance of a license, renewal of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern shall submit to the Board the statement prescribed by the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.520</u>. The statement must be completed and signed by the applicant.

2. The Board shall include the statement required pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 in:

(a) The application or any other forms that must be submitted for the issuance or renewal of the license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern; or

(b) A separate form prescribed by the Board.

3. A license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern may not be issued or renewed by the Board if the applicant:

(a) Fails to submit the statement required pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1; or

(b) Indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order.

4. If an applicant indicates on the statement submitted pursuant to subsection 1 that the applicant is subject to a court order for the support of a child and is not in compliance with the order or a plan approved by the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order for the repayment of the amount owed pursuant to the order, the Board shall advise the applicant to contact the district attorney or other public agency enforcing the order to determine the actions that the applicant may take to satisfy the arrearage.

NRS 623A.187 Crediting of work experience; regulations; applicant required to comply with requirements for education and experience before taking examination.

1. For the purpose of issuing a license certificate of registration or a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, the Board shall credit work experience as follows:

(a) One hundred and thirty hours or more of work in the practice of landscape architecture completed during a month is equal to 1 month of work experience.

(b) Eighty-five hours or more but less than one hundred and thirty hours of work in the practice of landscape architecture completed during a month is equal to one-half of a month of work experience.

2. The Board shall not grant credit for work experience to an applicant for less than 85 hours of work experience in the practice of landscape architecture completed during a month.

3. Before the Board may grant credit to an applicant for work experience pursuant to the provisions of this section, the employer of the applicant must submit proof satisfactory to the Board that the applicant completed the work experience for which the applicant wishes to receive credit.

4. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, all work experience must be completed under the direct supervision of a holder of a certificate of registration. The Board may adopt regulations that provide for the granting of credit for not more than 1 year of work experience completed under the direct supervision of a person who is licensed in a profession other than the practice of landscape architecture.

5. Each applicant for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern must, before taking one or more examinations required for the license or certificate, comply with the requirements for education and experience set forth in this chapter and any regulations adopted by the Board.

NRS 623A.190 Examination; prohibition on participation in preparing or grading examination.

1. The Board shall administer or cause to be administered a written examination to each applicant for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern.

2. The examination must be given at such times and places and under such supervision as the Board may determine.

3. The Board may include in the written examination any theoretical or applied fields and ethical issues it deems appropriate to determine professional skills and judgment.

4. Except as otherwise provided in <u>NRS 622.090</u>, the Board shall, by regulation, establish the grade that is required to pass the written examination.

5. The written examination may be waived by the Board if the applicant:

(a) Presents documentation that he or she has passed an examination in another state or country that has been accepted as an equivalent by a national association of registered boards; or

(b) Has been certified by such an organization.

6. Written examination papers must be destroyed after a license certificate of registration or certificate practice as a landscape architect intern is issued.

7. If the applicant fails to pass the written examination or any part thereof, the applicant may retake the examination or the part failed in a subsequent examination upon the payment of the applicable fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.240</u>.

8. The member of the Board who is a representative of the general public shall not participate in preparing or grading any examination required by the Board.

NRS 623A.193 Certificate of registration License: Issuance without examination. The Board may issue a license certificate of registration without examination to a person who submits evidence satisfactory to the Board that he or she:

1. Is licensed, registered or certified as a landscape architect in another jurisdiction if, as determined by the Board, the qualifications required for the license, registration or certification

are substantially equivalent to the qualifications set forth in this chapter for the issuance of a license certificate of registration; and

2. Is otherwise qualified for a license certificate of registration to engage in the practice of landscape architecture in this State.

NRS 623A.195 Certificate of registration: Issuance and use of seal; regulations; unlawful acts.

1. Upon issuing a license certificate of registration, the Board shall issue to the holder of the license certificate of registration a seal of the design authorized by the Board, bearing the name of the holder of the license certificate of registration, the number of the license certificate of registration and the title "landscape architect."

2. A plan, specification, report or other document issued by a licensee holder of a certificate of registration for official use must be signed, sealed and dated on the title page by him or her with a permanently legible imprint of his or her seal and signature. The Board may adopt regulations specifying the manner in which a holder of a license certificate of registration may electronically transmit such a plan, specification, report or other document.

3. It is unlawful for a person to stamp or seal any plan, specification, report or other document with the seal of a licensee holder of a certificate of registration after the license certificate of registration has expired or has been suspended or revoked, unless the license certificate of registration has been renewed or reissued.

NRS 623A.200 Certificate of registration License: Expiration, renewal or reinstatement; issuance of renewal card; record of renewal; unlawful acts.

1. Each license certificate of registration expires on June 30 next following the date of issuance.

2. A license certificate of registration may be renewed for 1 year from each succeeding July 1, upon submission of:

(a) The annual renewal fee prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS</u> <u>623A.240</u>;

(b) Proof of compliance with the requirements established by the Board for continuing education for the renewal of the certificate of registration; and

(c) All information required to complete the renewal.

3. A license certificate of registration that has expired through failure to be renewed may be renewed at any time within 1 year after the date of its expiration upon application to and with

the approval of the Board and upon payment of the annual renewal fee and the delinquency fee prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.240</u>.

4. A license certificate of registration that has expired for failure to be renewed within 1 year after the date of its expiration may be reinstated by the Board without examination within 3 years after the date the license certificate of registration expires upon application to and with the approval of the Board and upon payment of:

(a) The annual renewal fee for each year, or part thereof, the license certificate of registration is not renewed;

(b) The delinquency fee; and

(c) The reinstatement fee.

5. If a holder of a license certificate of registration submits to the Board the annual renewal fee, proof and information required pursuant to the provisions of subsection 2, or if the Board approves the renewal or reinstatement of a license certificate of registration pursuant to the provisions of subsection 3 or 4, the Executive Director of the Board shall, upon receipt of the applicable fees, proof and information or upon receipt of the approval of the Board, issue a renewal card to the applicant, indicating that the license certificate of registration is renewed for 1 year. The renewal card must bear the seal of the Board and include:

(a) The number of the license certificate of registration; and

(b) The signature of the President or Executive Director of the Board or a facsimile of that signature.

6. The renewal of a license certificate of registration and the number of the license certificate of registration must be recorded by the Executive Director of the Board in accordance with the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.135</u>.

7. The unauthorized use or display of a license certificate of registration or renewal card for that license certificate of registration, or the seal of a licensee holder of a certificate of registration, is unlawful.

NRS 623A.210 Certificate of registration license: New license certificate required after failure to renew within 3 years. If a license certificate of registration has not been renewed within 3 years after its expiration, the holder of the license certificate of registration may apply for and obtain a new certificate of registration if he or she:

- 1. Is otherwise eligible;
- 2. Pays all fees required by this chapter;
- 3. Passes an examination administered or approved by the Board; and

4. Establishes to the satisfaction of the Board that he or she is qualified to practice landscape architecture.

NRS 623A.215 Certificate of registration license : Continuing education; regulations. The Board may, by regulation, require each holder of a license certificate of registration to complete a course of continuing education as a condition for the renewal of the certificate of registration. The regulations must include the number of hours of continuing education that the holder of the certificate of registration must complete to renew the certificate.

NRS 623A.220 Certificate of registration license: Renewal of license suspended certificate; reinstatement of revoked license certificate.

1. A suspended license certificate of registration expires unless it is renewed by the holder of the license certificate of registration. The renewal does not entitle the holder to engage in the practice of landscape architecture until the expiration of the suspension period or until the license certificate of registration is reinstated by the Board.

2. A revoked license certificate of registration expires and is not subject to renewal. If the license certificate of registration is reinstated after its expiration, the holder of the license certificate of registration shall pay the fee for reinstatement prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.240</u>.

NRS 623A.225 Issuance of temporary license certificate prohibited. The Board shall not issue a temporary license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern.

NRS 623A.230 Notification of Executive Director upon change of address or if license certificate of registration is lost, stolen, destroyed or mutilated; duplicate license certificate of registration; regulations.

1. A licensee holder of a certificate of registration shall notify the Executive Director in writing of any change of address of his or her business or residence and if the license certificate of registration has been lost, stolen, destroyed or mutilated.

2. The Executive Director shall issue a duplicate license certificate of registration in accordance with regulations established by the Board upon application and payment of the fee for replacement of a certificate of registration prescribed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 623A.240</u>.

2. In addition to the fees set forth in subsection 1, the Board may charge and collect a fee for the expedited processing of a request, credit card usury, electronic payment fee or for any other incidental service it provides. The fee must not exceed the cost incurred by the Board to provide the service.

3. The Board may authorize a landscape architect intern to pay the application fee or any portion of that fee during any period in which he or she is the holder of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern. If a landscape architect intern pays the fee or any portion of the fee during that period, the Board shall credit the amount paid towards the entire amount of the application fee for the certificate of registration required pursuant to this section.

4. The fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to this section must be paid in United States currency in the form of a check, cashier's check, or money order, electronic payment, credit card or debit card, or direct deposit. If any payment check submitted to the Board is dishonored upon presentation for payment, repayment of the fee, including the fee for a returned check or payment method in the amount established by the State Controller pursuant to <u>NRS 353C.115</u>, must be made by money order or certified check.

5. The fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to this section must be paid in advance and are non-refundable.

6. Fees paid for during the current Fiscal Year will not be carried over to the following Fiscal Year, Except those applicants who are within 90 days of the new fiscal year. Those applicants within 90 days of the new fiscal year will have until the following quarter to complete the application process. Failure to complete the process within the specified time will void the application. A new application and fees will be required for those failing to complete the application within the specified time.

NRS 623A.250 Conditions under which business organization or association may practice landscape architecture; conditions under which landscape architects may form business organizations or associations with certain other persons; business organization or association and certain owners responsible for violations.

1. A firm, partnership, corporation or association may engage in the practice of landscape architecture if:

(a) All work is performed under the supervision and direction of a license holder of a certificate of registration;

(b) The name of the licensee holder of a certificate of registration appears in the name of the firm, partnership, corporation or association;

(c) The name of the licensee holder of the certificate of registration appears on all papers or documents used in the practice of landscape architecture; and

(d) All instruments of service are signed by the licensee holder of the certificate of registration.

2. Architects, registered interior designers, residential designers, professional engineers and landscape architects may, in accordance with <u>NRS 623.349</u>, join or form a partnership, corporation, limited-liability company or other business organization or association with registrants and licensees outside of their field of practice, or with persons who are not registered or licensed.

3. Each office or place of business of any partnership, corporation, limited-liability company or other business organization or association engaged in the practice of landscape architecture pursuant to the provisions of subsection 2 shall have a landscape architect who is a resident of this State and holds a license certificate of registration issued pursuant to this chapter regularly working in the office or place of business and directly responsible for the administration of the landscape architectural work conducted in the office or place of business.

4. A registrant or licensee practicing in a business organization or association pursuant to subsection 2 remains subject to <u>NRS 89.220</u>.

5. If a person who is not a holder of a license certificate of registration, or if a license holder of a certificate of registration who is not an owner, and who is employed by or affiliated with a business organization or association that holds a certificate issued pursuant to <u>NRS</u> 623.349 is found by the Board to have violated a provision of this chapter or a regulation adopted by the Board, the Board may hold the business organization or association and each holder of a license or certificate of registration who is an owner responsible for the violation.

NRS 623A.260 Conditions under which business organization or association may establish and operate branch offices.

1. A firm, partnership, corporation or association engaged in the practice of landscape architecture may, upon the approval of the Board, establish and operate branch offices within this State.

2. A branch office must be operated by a resident landscape architect who holds a license certificate of registration.

3. Offices established for the purpose of observing construction work on a project are considered branch offices.

DISCIPLINARY AND OTHER ACTIONS

NRS 623A.270 Authorized actions of Board; conditions of probation; orders imposing discipline deemed public records; private reprimands prohibited; regulations.

1. The Board may:

(a) Suspend or revoke a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern;

(b) Refuse to renew a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern;

(c) Place a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern on probation;

(d) Issue a public reprimand to a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern;

(e) Impose upon a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each violation of this chapter;

(f) Require a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern to pay restitution; or

(g) Take such other disciplinary action as the Board deems appropriate,

 \hat{E} if the holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern has committed any act set forth in <u>NRS 623A.280</u>.

2. The conditions for probation imposed pursuant to the provisions of subsection 1 may include, without limitation:

(a) Restriction on the scope of professional practice;

(b) Peer review;

(c) Education or counseling;

(d) The payment of restitution to each person who suffered harm or loss; and

(e) The payment of all costs of the administrative investigation and prosecution.

3. An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.

4. The Board shall not issue a private reprimand to a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern.

5. The Board may adopt regulations setting forth a schedule of fines for the purposes of paragraph (e) of subsection 1.

NRS 623A.280 Grounds.

1. The following acts, among others, constitute cause for disciplinary action:

(a) A licensee holder of a certificate of registration has signed or sealed instruments of service which were not prepared by him or her or under his or her direct supervision.

(b) A licensee holder of a certificate of registration has permitted the use of his or her signature or seal by another person to evade the provisions of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the Board.

(c) A licensee holder of a certificate of registration has not signed, sealed or dated instruments of service prepared by him or her.

(d) A licensee holder of a certificate of registration or a holder of a certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern impersonates a landscape architect or landscape architect intern of the same or similar name.

(e) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern practices under an assumed, fictitious or corporate name.

(f) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern practices landscape architecture in violation of the provisions of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the Board.

(g) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern has obtained the license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern by fraud or misrepresentation.

(h) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is guilty of fraud or deceit in the practice of landscape architecture.

(i) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is guilty of incompetency, negligence or gross negligence.

(j) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is convicted of or enters a plea of nolo contendere to any crime an essential element of which is dishonesty or which is directly related to the practice of landscape architecture.

(k) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is guilty of aiding or abetting any person in the violation of the provisions of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the Board.

(I) A person practices as a landscape architect with a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern that has expired or has been suspended or revoked.

(m) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is disciplined by an agency of another state or foreign country which regulates the practice of landscape architecture and at least one of the grounds for the disciplinary action taken is a ground for disciplinary action pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

(n) A holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern fails to comply with an order issued by the Board or to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the Board.

2. As used in this section:

(a) "Gross negligence" means conduct that demonstrates a reckless disregard of the consequences affecting the life or property of another person.

(b) "Incompetency" means conduct that, in the practice of landscape architecture, demonstrates a significant lack of ability, knowledge or fitness to discharge a professional obligation.

(c) "Negligence" means a deviation from the normal standard of professional care exercised generally by other members in the practice of landscape architecture.

NRS 623A.285 Suspension of license certificate for failure to pay support or comply with certain subpoenas or warrants; reinstatement of certificate. [Effective until 2 years after the date of the repeal of 42 U.S.C. § 666, the federal law requiring each state to establish procedures for withholding, suspending and restricting the professional, occupational and recreational licenses for child support arrearages and for noncompliance with certain processes relating to paternity or child support proceedings.]

1. If the Board receives a copy of a court order issued pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS</u> <u>425.540</u> that provides for the suspension of all professional, occupational and recreational licenses, certificates and permits issued to a person who is the holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern, the Board shall deem the license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern issued to that person to be suspended at the end of the 30th day after the date on which the court order was issued unless the Board receives a letter issued to the holder of the license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.550</u> stating that the holder of the license complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.560</u>.

2. The Board shall reinstate a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern that has been suspended by a district court pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.540</u> if the Board receives a letter issued by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.550</u> to the person whose license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern was suspended stating that the person whose license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern was suspended has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to the provisions of <u>NRS 425.560</u>.

NRS 623A.290 Complaint against licensee holder of certificate: Contents; filing.

1. The Board, any member of the Board or any other person who becomes aware that any one or more of the grounds for initiating disciplinary action may exist as to a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern may file a complaint specifying the relative facts with the Executive Director of the Board.

2. A complaint must be made in writing and be signed and verified by the person making it.

NRS 623A.305 Consideration of complaint by President of Board Executive Director; recommendation to Board; action by Board.

1. When a A complaint is filed with the Executive Director of the Board will be reviewed by the Executive Director. it must be considered by the President of the Board or a member of the Board designated by the President. If it appears to the Executive Director the President or the person designated by the President that further proceedings are warranted, he or she shall report the results of the investigation together with a recommendation to the Board in a manner which does not violate the right of the person charged in the complaint to due process in any later hearing on the complaint.

2. The Board shall promptly make a determination with respect to each complaint reported to it by the Executive Director President or a person designated by the President and shall dismiss the complaint or proceed with disciplinary action pursuant to <u>chapter 622A</u> of NRS.

NRS 623A.350 Limitations on complaints.

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a complaint must not be filed against the holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern if 2 years or more have elapsed since the occurrence of the act or omission alleged as the ground for disciplinary action.

2. If the act or omission alleges fraud or misrepresentation, the complaint must be filed within 2 years after the discovery of the fraud or misrepresentation.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

NRS 623A.351 Immunity from civil action. In addition to any other immunity provided by the provisions of <u>chapter 622A</u> of NRS:

Any person who, in good faith and without malicious intent, provides information concerning a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern or an applicant for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is immune from any civil action for providing that information.

2. Any person who assists the Board in the investigation or prosecution of an alleged violation of a provision of this chapter, a proceeding concerning the issuance or renewal of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern or a criminal prosecution is immune from any civil liability for:

(a) Any decision or action taken in good faith and without malicious intent in response to information acquired by the Board; and

(b) Disseminating information concerning a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern or an applicant for a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern to:

- (1) Any other licensing board;
- (2) A national association of registered boards;
- (3) An agency of this State or the Federal Government;
- (4) The Attorney General; or
- (5) Any law enforcement agency.

NRS 623A.353 Confidentiality of certain records of Board; exceptions. [Replaced in revision by <u>NRS 623A.137</u>.]

NRS 623A.355 Inclusion of number of licensee certificate of registration in advertising and business cards. All advertising by or business cards of a holder of a license certificate of registration must include the number of the certificate of registration.

NRS 623A.357 Allegation and proof of license certificate in action for compensation. No person may bring or maintain any action in the courts of this State for the collection of compensation for the performance of any act or contract for which a holder of a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern is required by this chapter without alleging and proving that the plaintiff in the action was licensed-registered pursuant to the provisions of this chapter at all times during the performance of the act or contract.

PROHIBITED ACTS; PENALTIES; ENFORCEMENT

NRS 623A.360 Prohibited acts; penalty. Any person who:

1. Violates any of the provisions of this chapter;

2. Having had his or her license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern suspended or revoked, continues to solicit business or otherwise represent himself or herself as a landscape architect or landscape architect intern;

3. Engages in the practice of landscape architecture without holding a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern; or

4. Uses the title or term "landscape architect," "landscape designer," "landscape consultant," "landscape draftsman" or "landscape architect intern," or any other title or term indicating or implying that the person is a landscape architect or landscape architect intern, in any sign, card, listing, advertisement or in any other manner without holding a license as a landscape architect certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern,

Ê is guilty of a misdemeanor.

NRS 623A.365 Civil penalty.

1. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a person who violates any provision of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the Board is subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 for each violation. Any such penalty must be imposed by the Board at a hearing conducted pursuant to the provisions of <u>chapter 622A</u> of NRS.

2. If a person does not pay a civil penalty imposed pursuant to subsection 1 within 60 days after the order of the Board becomes final, the order may be executed upon in the same manner as a judgment issued by a court.

NRS 623A.370 Injunctive relief; remedies cumulative.

1. A violation of a provision of this chapter by a person:

(a) Unlawfully representing himself or herself as a landscape architect, landscape designer, landscape consultant, landscape draftsman or landscape architect intern, or using any other title or term indicating or implying that he or she is a landscape architect or landscape architect intern; or

(b) Engaging in the practice of landscape architecture,

Ê without holding a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern, may be enjoined by a district court on petition by the Executive Director President of the Board in the name of the Board. In any such proceeding, it is not necessary to show that any person is individually injured.

2. If the respondent in a proceeding specified in subsection 1 is found guilty of:

(a) Unlawfully representing himself or herself as a landscape architect, landscape designer, landscape consultant, landscape draftsman or landscape architect intern, or using any other title or term indicating or implying that he or she is a landscape architect or landscape architect intern; or

(b) Engaging in the practice of landscape architecture,

 \hat{E} without holding a license certificate of registration or certificate to practice as a landscape architect intern, the court shall enjoin the respondent from continuing that representation, usage or practice. The procedure in such cases must be the same as in any other application for an injunction. The remedy by injunction is in addition to any criminal prosecution and punishment or any disciplinary action taken by the Board.
